Ian Pounder (Hartlepool Saint Hilda) writes:

Saint Mary's Church has a pipe organ by Denman of York, built in 1886. It has not been altered since that time; it was restored in the 1960s but when the building was re-wired 15 or more years ago, the blower was not connected. The first time it was heard in public since then was a few months ago; the blower had been re-connected, and an interested church member asked me to go and play a couple of pieces one Sunday morning as a surprise for the congregation. There were a few sticking and silent notes, but overall it worked remarkably well. It has a bright sound which projects well into the church from the West gallery.

They now hope to restore the organ, and the start of the project is being marked by a recital by Daniel Cook (Durham Cathedral) on 18th June at 7.30pm. The recital will last approximately 1 hour, followed by refreshments.
